4TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Median income of \$54,861 falls behind other transitional counties in the state.
- Poverty rate is relatively high at 14.2%.
- Identified by the U.S. Census Bureau as one of the top ten fastest growing counties in the nation.





GRANT INNOVATIONS


- Budget increase of 218% -- from \$420,600 to \$1,336,538.50 over three years.

- A full-time social worker to provide assistance to the legal defense team in child welfare cases (a first in Utah!).
- Regionalization -- independent oversight and monitoring provided by Utah County Public Defender's Office.



Nephi City

CITY JUSTICE COURT

- Largest city in Juab County, Utah.
- Median income is 13% lower than the state average.
- Poverty rate is 11.7%, higher than the state rate of 9.7%.






- Budget increase of 151% -- from \$39,600 to \$99,300 over three years.

Utah County

4TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Second-largest county in the state with over 600,000 people.
- Fourth-fastest growing county in the state with 17.4% growth between 2010 and 2018.
- Youngest population in the state with an average age of 24.4.





GRANT INNOVATIONS

- Separate funds for defense resources and attorney training.
- Funding for law clerks to assist with cases and receive defense-specific experience prior to becoming full-time attorneys with the Utah County Public Defender's Office.
- Funding for rent to expand office capacity and support an increase in the number of attorneys.



Pleasant Grove City AND Lindon City

CITY JUSTICE COURTS

- Pleasant Grove City is the fifth-largest city in Utah County by population and has seen a 15.5% increase since 2010.
- Lindon City ranks fifth in the county for number of people per household despite its slower growth rate.





GRANT INNOVATIONS


- Funding for attorneys to maintain an hourly rate rather than a flat fee contract.
- Separate funds for defense resources and attorney training.
- An administrative assistant to increase the capacity in tracking of appointed cases.
- Regionalization -- two cities working together to ensure that indigent defense services are available in the justice courts.



Sanpete County

6TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Median income ranks in the bottom third for the state at \$59,928.
- Poverty rate is the fourth-highest in the state at 14.2%.
- Intergenerational poverty persists as about 800 children are at risk of remaining in poverty as adults.
- The second state prison (Central Utah Correctional Facility) is located in Gunnison.







Millard County

4TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Median income is 10% lower than the state average.
- Poverty rate is relatively high at 12.4%.





- Regionalization -- independent oversight and monitoring provided by Utah County Public Defender's Office.



Salt Lake County

3RD JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Most densely populated county in the state with more than 1 million people.
- Highest number of caseloads in District, Juvenile, and Justice Courts.
- The largest prison (Utah State Prison) and jail (Salt Lake County Jail) in the state are both located within the county.



IDC GRANT: \$368,529.60

LENGTH: 2 YEARS

- Attorneys: \$368,529.60

GRANT INNOVATIONS


- Funding to expand the capacity of Salt Lake Legal Defenders in order to keep up with caseloads associated with Operation Rio Grande.
- Improving caseloads -- hiring two additional attorneys to provide representation on Justice Court misdemeanor and Orders to Show Cause (OSC) cases.



Summit County

3RD JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Steady county growth with an 11% population increase between 2010 and 2018.
- Fluctuating unemployment rate due to seasonally-based employment.





- Attorneys: \$60,000

GRANT INNOVATIONS


- Budget increase of 21% -- from \$303,315 to \$368,315 over one year.
- Improving attorney specialization -- a designated attorney in juvenile delinquency cases.
- Adequate compensation for attorneys -- increasing the compensation for a qualified attorney in the Justice Court.
- Appellate funding -- zealous appellate representation helps to better protect due process and ensure fairness.



Sevier County

6TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Poverty rate is 28% higher than the state average.
- Third-highest rate of food stamp recipients in the state.
- Intergenerational poverty persists with 15% of children living in poverty and 22% at risk of remaining in poverty as adults.







Wayne County

6TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Median income is \$42,444, the second-lowest in the state.
- Poverty rate is the fifth-highest in the state at 13.7%.
- Unemployment rate is 7.4%, the highest of all Utah counties except Garfield.




IDC GRANT: \$20,000

LENGTH: 1 YEAR

- Attorneys: \$15,000

GRANT INNOVATIONS

- Budget increase of 93% -- from \$21,500 to \$41,500 over one year.
- Improving caseloads -- funding a separate contract for a conflict attorney to expand capacity and handle cases in a manner that is free from conflicts of interest.
- Appellate funding -- zealous appellate representation helps to better protect due process and ensure fairness.



Carbon County

7TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Median income is \$15,000 below the state average.
- Poverty rate is 50% higher than the state average.
- Unemployment rate is 2% higher than the state average.
- Second-highest rate of food stamp recipients in the state.
- Opioid overdose death rate is three times higher than the state rate.





LENGTH: 2 YEARS

- Attorneys: \$180,000
- Administrative Assistant: \$4,000
- Reserve Funds: \$20,000
- Travel: \$10,000
- Attorney Training: \$2,400

GRANT INNOVATIONS

- Budget increase of 43% -- from \$570,000 to \$815,600 over two years.
- Improving caseloads -- from one public defender to four public defenders handling 500 District Court and 300 Juvenile Court cases.
- Separate funds for defense resources, travel, and attorney training.
- Funding for rent to expand office capacity and support an increase in the number of attorneys.



Daggett County

- Fluctuating annual unemployment rate from a low of 3.3% to a high of 6.6%.
- Loss of 30% in county revenue due to closure of Daggett County Jail.

- Managing Public Defender: \$267,000
- Attorneys: \$269,000
- Reserve Funds: \$31,450

Duchesne County

8TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

- Poverty rate of 13.3% is higher than the state average.
- Unemployment rate is 2% higher than the state average.

IDC GRANT: \$592,850


Uintah County

GRANT INNOVATIONS


- Budget increase of 57% -- from \$1,047,050 to \$1,639,900 over one year for all three counties.

Ogden City

CITY JUSTICE COURT

- One of the busiest justice courts in the state with 3,303 criminal cases filed in Fiscal Year 2018.
- Median income is \$43,361, nearly 34% lower than the state average.
- Unemployment rate is 6.4%, higher than the state rate of 3.2%.




